

History

FoE Brisbane first formed in 1970 and has continued through most of these years in various guises. We have filled a niche in the South East Queensland environmental movement since initiation in recognition of the radical social change required to ensure ecological integrity and social justice prevail.

Aims and Objectives

- 1. Stimulate a movement of social change towards a socially just and ecologically sustainable society
- 2. Halt the destruction of ecosystems and the corresponding loss of biological diversity and ecological processes
 - 3. Restore and encourage the restoration of degraded ecosystems.
 - 4. Encourage the ecologically sustainable and socially just use and distribution of the earth's resources

Aims and Objectives

- 5. Encourage local community self reliance and autonomy
- 6. Encourage the development of a well informed and active community
- 7. Provide the organisational framework and infrastructure to support the social change, community development and ecological restoration/conservation aspirations of members.

Consensus Decision Making

All members active within the organisation have decision making powers. "Consensus" is the idea that ideally the group is best served if all members of a group agree to a given course action.

We meet twice a month to discuss organisational issues and make strategic decisions. We strive for 100% consensus when making decisions however recognise that this is not always possible and provide persons with the right to abstain or block a decision.













Constructive and Oppositional Politics

Non-Violent Direct Action

NVDA is a fundamental pillar of our organisation as an historically effective way to nourish community change. We believe non-violent direct action is an enabling tool available to all Australians to influence political, social and economic situations.

We are currently using NVDA to highlight the inappropriateness of coal mining and exportation throughout Queensland. Non-violent direct action has been an effective strategy to initiate media dialogue.
