"Icecubes" is a hard hitting, hysterically funny, scathing indictment of the American New World Order.

He uses hypothetical settings relevant to our present situation, adopting a "whimsically serious" and "flippantly cynical" manner.

The characters are varied and quirky, the dialogue is punchy and confronting, the plot is totally credible yet peppered with unpredictable twists and the scenarios are based on well researched science, politics and history.

Violence is employed only in the best possible taste - never gratuitous: there are just four beheadings and only a small amount of cannibalism!

The enigmatic term "icecubes" is not what you may think - all is revealed ultimately.

Repeated readings will reveal ever deeper layers of meaning and subtlety not appreciated at first glance. An absolute gem to spark vigorous discussion at book clubs.

A word of caution though: this book is for thinking readers only!


